the airport, what prevents even larger aircraft, like passenger jets (commercial air service) from using the airport? Answer: The City does not have, and is not required to seek, a permit to operate a commercial airport. No one is even contemplating creating a commercial airport. Without such a permit, regular commercial airline service cannot be introduced at the airport. In addition, there are terrain and other issues that would make it very difficult for the City to make the improvements that would be required to accommodate airlines. To be clear, the FAA cannot, and an airline cannot, force the City to accept airline service. Question: Can we prevent larger planes from utilizing the Heber Valley Airport? Answer: No. Every airport is designed for maximum size and speed of aircraft. If an aircraft can safely use the airport, federal law prohibits the City from preventing that aircraft from using the airport. If an aircraft is too large to safely operate, that is the FAA's and the pilot's responsibility, not the City's obligation, to know that it would be unsafe to operate at the airport. Of course, if a large aircraft were to land anyway, and were to damage our facility because of weight or speed, the owners of that aircraft would be held responsible. One of the reasons that the FAA has asked the City to undertake the Master Plan is that the FAA data shows that somewhat larger aircraft would use this airport if it were safe to do so. The Master Plan process is designed to help the City make a decision whether to update the safety standards for those larger planes. I see and read Yes

The placement of the camera at A1 missed as far as I can tell, all glider aero tow operations which operate from A2 as intersection departures. As a hangar owner, private pilot, with instrument, and glider ratings, as well as owner Single Engine piston and glider aircraft, I can attest to my average # of glider flights annually from 2015 - 2019 to be in excess of 80 flights annually, and somewhere around 240 hours annually. Even if you were to extrapolate conservatively to 15 gliders, doing 40 flights per year, you would be missing at least 600 flight operations, takeoffs and 600 landings in your calculations. Lastly, it cannot be underestimated that the OK3's tactics and attitudes have pushed glider operations out of the Heber airport. Large jets and the clientele on those jets often are in a rush and I have seen numerous safety concerns between 2000 and 2019 that are due to jets not following regulations and giving priority to gliders that are absolutely within regulations and rights to be flying from the Heber airport.

In reviewing the meeting handout with its non viable preliminary alternatives and the facts delivered by the experts I feel that you are totaly justified in proceeding forward with the Southwest Runway Shift Concept and seeking a C-II certification. If my understanding is correct, by the time we meet the FAA safety requirrements for our B-II airport there are very few additional requiremnts for upgrading to a C-II. I feel, howerer, that this is where capacity for larger aircraft should end. Speeking as a Charleston resident and living directly in the flightpath, I agree with the safety concept of lowering air traffic at the north runway's heavely populated areas of Heber City in favor of more southern activity over Charleston and Daniel which are and will likely remain low density areas. I understand that this is currently being recomended for air traffic. Regarding hanger row movement: As you are considering alternative solutions, I recoment that you contaact Valgarson House Movers who have been successfully moving large structures for over fifty years. As the new hanger row pad would only be 27 to 30 feet east from its current position I can envision them being pulled intace, if not the whole row, individually or in groups, to their new location. Hangers B-1 and B-2 would be trucked intact to their new pad. As it comes to finances I suggest, if you can make it happen, Email via website Yes
